3.3 Be a Good Teammate

- Encourage others and help them if they're having a hard time.
- Don't tease, bully, or exclude anyone.
- Celebrate team success and support each other through challenges.

3.4 Be Safe and Responsible

- Follow safety rules and listen to your coach or team manager.
- Tell an adult if you feel unsafe, worried, or hurt—you have the right to speak up.
- Look after your **horse and gear**, and treat animals with care and respect.

3.5 Use Good Language and Behavior

- No swearing, shouting in anger, or being rude.
- Don't damage property, litter, or mess up shared spaces.
- Be on your best behavior on and off the field, including online.
